

The mission of the ‘ ’ degree programme in Physiotherapy and Special Motor Skills.

► **The specific mission** within society, as established by FEFS, is:

► **The scientific research mission** focuses on developing the skills required to carry out experimental research and case studies within the faculty's own scientific research centre and the students' scientific research society, as well as within INCESA, under the guidance of the faculty's teaching staff. Thus, the structure of the evaluated study programme ensures a match between learning outcomes, acquired skills and professional roles in the labour market. In accordance with these qualifications, the university degree provides graduates of the Kinesiotherapy and Special Motor Skills specialisation with opportunities for social integration through the possibility of pursuing a professional career.
